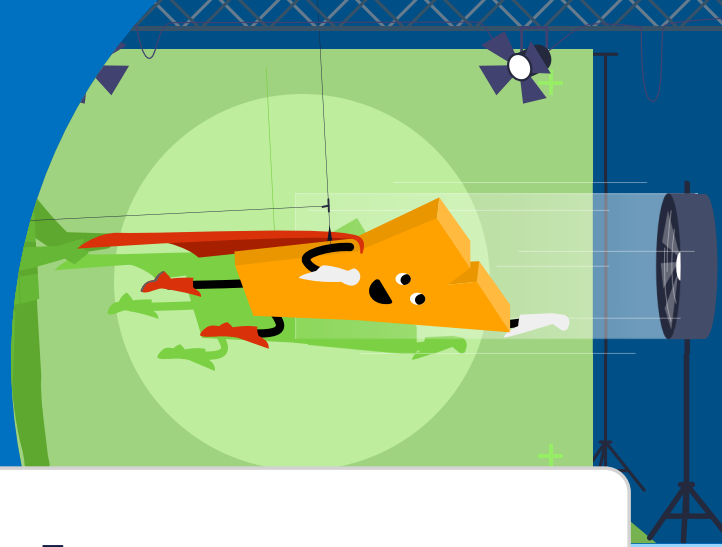


Inside the Articulate Storyline Animation Studio

Helpful Hints



Animation Types

- Entrance and Exit Animations determine how an object appears or disappears from the slide stage
- Emphasis Animations can be used to direct the learner's attention but also for subtle or creative effects
- Motion Paths increase visual engagement by moving an object from one point to another

Commonly Used Entrance Animations

- Fade, Fly In, Float (The 3 F's)

These tend to look the most clean/modern and can handle most of your animation needs

Duration and Effect Options

- The default duration for animations is 0.75s and often looks perfect, but this setting can be adjusted to achieve specific outcomes
- Animations have options, which are settings that can be changed to determine the direction and, depending on the animation type, adjust other things like the shape

Effective animation helps learners understand **where to focus**, **reveals information at the right moment**, and **creates a smoother flow** through content. Animation should **always serve a purpose**. Use animation to support learning, not simply to show that animation is possible.
